Boston (77-955), Newark (77-434), and New York (77-2195), refer to their respective files in the case captioned "Maria Angela de Blasio, Office of the Coordinator of Information, Special Inquiry." The afore-mentioned applicant-type investigation which was conducted in 1942 was brought up to date by the New York Office in 1944 in the case entitled "Maria Angela de Blasio, Employee, Office of war Information, Internal Security - Hatch Act," New York file/101-551. An associate of captioned person in the Office of var Information, reported Mss de Blasio to be a member of the Communist Party. Several other individuals stated that are propaganda directed toward Italy bore the pro-Communist viewpoint as a result of Miss Blasio's personal consorship All offices review your respective reports thoroughly. **.**

(77-15731)New York refer to the report of Special Agent Roger W. Robinson dated 5-15-46, New York, New York, entitled "Boris Michael Morros, Internal Security-R, New York file 100-48840. This report indicates that

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subject Morros while in New York, had telephoned a number listed to Maria de Blasio, 56 West 56th Street, New York, New York. Since the significance of the afore-mentioned information is not known and cannot be set forth in an investigative report, it must be kept in mind during the course of this inquiry. (100-202315, serial 219 - Mocase)

The attention of WFO and New York is directed to their respective files captioned "John A. Sullivan, Jr., Applicant, Centeral Intelligence Group, " New York file 118-543 and Washington Field file 118-1281. Sullivan, who reportedly was sympathetic to the Communist Party, was friendly with Maria de Blasio. (118-1227 serial 7)

New York refer to the report of SA William P. Fitzpatrick dated June 26, 1950, New York, New York, captioned "Doris Nicholasen Sullivan, aka, Army, LGE." This report contains the documentation of Maria de Blasio and her associates at the Office of War Information. By memorandum dated December 1, 1950, the Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, advised that Doris Nicholasen Sullivan was "Not processed under Executive Order 9835. Reinstated under P. L. 808 on appeal of Secretary of Army." (121-6344 serial 26)

The report of SA William R. Fish dated 11-20-50.

New York, New York, captioned "Maurice English, Information and Editorial Specialist, General - Appointee, Division of Personnel, Federal Security Agency, Chicago, Illinois, IGE," reflects that English was very close with one Maria de Blasio. By memorandum dated January 5, 1953, the Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, advised that the disposition of Maurice English's case was "This form cancels number four on the same individual dated December 23, 1952. Loyalty Review Board still has case under consideration." For your information, the Loyalty Review Board on December 23, 1952, had previously advised that Maurice English was "Eligible on loyalty." (121-23573 serial 27)

New York (77-11557), Boston (77-4062), WFO (77-30997), and Baltimore (77-3842), refer to your respective files regarding Warren Wilhelm, ska Kingsley Wilhelm, Special Inquiry, Bureau of the Budget," who is apparently the

husband of captioned person. Review reports thoroughly in view of the considerable unfavorably information contained therein regarding Mrs. Wilhelm. Baltimore should consider reinterviewing Jay David Whittaker Chambers re Mrs. Wilhelm.

For the information of the afore-mentioned offices, the applicant-type reports regarding Warren Wilhelm were forwarded by the Bureau to the U. S. Civil Service Commission for consideration under EO 9835. By memorandum dated September 18, 1950, the Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, advised that "Warren Wilhelm, Fiscal Economist - Appointee, Bureau of the Budget, Washington, D. C., Loyalty of Government Employees," was "Eligible on loyalty." (77-45098)

The Bureau conducted an LGE investigation regarding one Donald Wilhelm in the case entitled "Donald Wilhelm, aka Donald Wilhelm, Jr., Chief Materials Requisition and Control Branch - Appointee, Federal Civil Defense Administration, Washington, D. C., LGE," who is apparently the brother of the afore-mentioned Warren Wilhelm. WFO, Boston and Baltimore refer to your respective files 121-18174, 121-2559 and 121-2509.

By memorandum dated April 18, 1952, the Chairman, Loyalty Review Board, U. S. Civil Service Commission, advised that Donald Wilhelm was "ligible on loyalty."



GARSIDE, RD #2, Neshanic Station, New Jersey, a reference, advised she knew MARIA de BLASIO as a frequent weekend guest at her home from 1938 to 1942, when she, Mrs. GARSIDE, lived in Somerville, N. J. She advised she met the employee through her son, TANNER M. CLARK, who, like the employee, was an artist at the time. She advised their discussions dealt mainly with literary and artistic things, and at no time during their discussions did the employee evidence any sympathy for any other form of government other than the democratic form of government. Mrs. GARSIDE stated that after the employee was married, she hardly ever saw her and hasn't had any contact with her for the last eleven years.

Mrs. GARSIDE advised that she always considered MARIA de BLASIO to be a highly intelligent, loyal American of good character, reputation and associates during the period that she knew her.

TANNER M. CLARK advised he met MARIA de BLASIO socially in New York City around 1938 through their both being artists at the time. The remainder of his comments were the same as that of his mother, Mrs. WALTER L. GARSIDE.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Birth date verified as May 14, 1917. Employee received A.B. degree June, 1938; M.A. degree June, 1939, at Smith College, Northampton, Massachusetts. Graduated magna cum laude, elected Phi Beta Kappa and was Neilson Scholar; was member of Italian Club, Press Board, Psychology Club. Faculty members speak of her in highest terms regarding intelligence, appearance and character. No criticism or disciplinary action against her. Employee attended Graduate School, Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Massachusetts, September, 1947 to January, 1950, and was enrolled in Regional Program on the Soviet Union. She failed to obtain M.A. degree due to failure in Soviet language. Dean of Graduate School and former professor, Radcliffe College, recommend employee favorably as to character, loyalty, reputation and associates. Employee was employed Houghton and Miflin Publishing Company, Boston, Massachusetts, while attending Radcliffe and was recommended favorably by her supervisor. Employee listed membership in Progressive Citizens of America, Boston, Massachusetts, October, 1947 to December, 1948. Reliable Informants, Boston, contacted but could furnish no information concerning employee. Neighborhood investigation Lexington, Massachusetts, favorable. No credit or criminal record.

III. RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

Education

Miss GIADYS DIGGS, Assistant in the Registrar's Office at Smith College, stated the employee received her A.B. degree in June, 1938. She was awarded her Master's degree in June, 1939. Miss de BIASIO majored in English. She graduated Magna Cum Laude and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. She was a Neilson Scholar, meaning that she was one of the leading scholars of her class. She was born in New York City on May 14, 1917.

Her activities included the Italian Club, Press Board and Psychology Club.

Miss BARBARA CROSBY, Personnel Office, referred to the Faculty Recommendations File on the employee, which is a composite of numerous faculty recommendations. It speaks in the highest terms of the employee. She was described as having keen intelligence, being sensible and realistic and having a due degree of self confidence. She has a very pleasant and attractive personality and makes a good appearance. She had unusual initiative and intellectual maturity. She is courteous, ambitious and cooperative with others. There were no criticisms made of her and all comments were favorable.

Mrs. BERNICE B. CRONKITE, Dean, Graduate School, Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Massachusetts, reviewed the scholastic record of MARIA WILHELM which indicated that the employee attended the Graduate School of Radcliffe College beginning in the summer term of 1947 until the end of the first term of the scholastic year 1949-50. Mrs. CRONKITE stated that the employee studied courses in Slavic, Economics and Social Sciences. The

record indicated that the terms of admission to the Graduate School were "Admitted to study toward the A.M. degree in the Regional Program on the Soviet Union." According to the information reflected in the employee's file, she was born May 14, 1917 at New York City, New York, the daughter of JOHN OF BLASIO and ANNA BRICENTI de BLASIO. The employee's husband's name is listed as WARREN WITHELM and his occupation as student at Harvard University, Cambridge, Massachusetts. Mrs. CRON-KITE stated that the employee had received an A.B. degree in 1938 and an A.M. degree in 1939 from Smith College, Northampton, Massachusetts. Mrs. CRONKITE said that she recalled the employee very well inasmuch as she had interviewed her upon her admittance to the Graduate School and had numerous conferences with the employee during the period she attended Radcliffe College. Mrs. CRONKITE advised that in her consideration the employee is a very intelligent, capable and aggressive individual extremely well qualified to handle a position of responsibility. She said that the employee is an "individualist with a mind of her own." Mrs. CRONKITE said that there is no reason in her mind to question the loyalty of the employee to the United States and said that she would consider the employee to be a good security risk. Mrs. CRONKITE said the employee enjoyed a good reputation during her attendance at Radcliffe College and to the best of her recollection, her associates were persons of good reputation.

It is to be noted that on the application for admittance to Radcliffe College, the employee furnished the following information concerning her background:

"My academic training and working experience have been concentrated in publications and information work, particularly in the international field.

"The importance of acquiring a detailed knowledge of Russia became apparent to me before the war. As circumstances permitted I have followed a course of language study and reading in the Russian field. By September I will have completed 8 months of private tutoring twice a week. I shall intensify this studying if I am admitted to the Regional Program on the Soviet Union. While in O.W.I. I applied for duty in Russia and plans were under way when personal reasons forced a change of plans.

"With our (my husband's and mine) combined background in Journalism and Economics we expect little difficulty in being assigned to Russia by a publication or a government agency." DONALD S. McKAY, Professor of History, Radcliffe College, Cambridge, Massachusetts, advised that he knew the employee during the entire course of her study at Radcliffe, at which time she was a member of the Russian phase of the Regional Studies Course. Doctor McKAY said that he considered the employee to be a very intelligent, capable girl, although he did not consider her to be a good "team" person. Doctor McKAY recalled that the employee was very interested in the Russian form of Government and maintained excellent grades in each of the subjects which she followed at Radcliffe. Doctor McKAY said that the employee, however, experienced difficulty in the Russian language and for that reason did not qualify for her M.A. degree. Doctor McKAY said that he has never known anything derogatory concerning the employee or any member of her family and he considered her to be a loyal American and a person of good reputation and character. Doctor McKAY said he would recommend her favorably for a responsible position.

Employment

Mr. PAUL BROOKS, Director, Houghton and Miflin Company, 2 Park Street, Boston, Massachusetts, advised that the employee worked at the Houghton and Miflin Company on a part-time basis editing and reviewing various publications. Mr. BROOKS said that the employee was so employed during the time she was studying for her Master's degree at Radcliffe College. Mr. BROOKS was unable to furnish the exact dates when the employee was with the Houghton and Miflin Company. Mr. BROOKS considered the employee to be a very intelligent individual who was well recommended to the Houghton and Miflin Company. He said that she did an excellent job at the Houghton and Miflin Company and is eligible for rehire. According to Mr. BROOKS, he knew the employee and her husband on a social basis and indicated that nothing unfavorable or derogatory concerning them has ever come to his attention. Mr. BROOKS further stated that he would consider the employee to be a good security risk and he would recommend her most favorably for a responsible position.

Neighborhood

Mrs. MARY T. DILLON, Housewife, 97 School Street, Lexington, Massachusetts, advised that she had been a neighbor of the employee and her husband since May, 1948. Mrs. DILLON said that she and her husband have visited the employee and her husband socially on numerous occasions and that the employee appears to be a high-type individual concerning whom she knows nothing which is of a derogatory nature. Mrs. DILLON said that she had no reason to question the loyalty of the employee or her husband and from her acquaintance with the employee and her family, she would be able to recommend her favorably for a responsible position.

Mrs. F. C. CLARK, 101 School Street, Lexington, Massachusetts, advised that she has known the employee as a neighbor for approximately three years. Mrs. CLARK said that the employee and her husband appear to be a very quiet couple and she and her own husband have visited socially with the employee and her family on numerous occasions. Mrs. CLARK said that she has had no reason to doubt the character or loyalty of the employee and that from her acquaintance with the employee, she could recommend her for a position of trust and confidence.

Membership in the Progressive Citizens of America

On the Identification and Personnel Data Form completed by the employee concerning her employment with the United Nations, she listed that from October, 1946, to December, 1947, she was a member of the Progressive Citizens of America at Boston, Massachusetts. The employee indicated that she did not hold any office with this organization.

The California House Committee on un-American Activities, 1947 report, page 369, and 1948 report, page 354, cited the Progressive Citizens of America as a new and broader Communist front for the entire United States formed in September, 1946, at the direction of the Communist Steering Committee from the Communist dominated National Citizens Political Action Committee and the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions.

Boston Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that on March 10, 1947, a meeting of Ward 5, Progressive Citizens of America in Boston, was held, at which time it was announced that a Citizens Housing Council had been formed under the direction of MARIA WIIHELM who, according to the informant, is believed to be a close friend of ANGUS CAMERON. Boston Informant T-1 was re-contacted and advised that he could furnish no additional information concerning the employee and refused to execute a signed statement or appear before a Loyalty Hearing Board.

Boston Informant T-2, of known reliability, who for many years was affiliated with some persons who now constitute the national leadership of the Communist Party, advised that he had known CAMERON in the past as a secret member of prominence in the Communist Party, USA.

Boston Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on May 11, 1947, that a Mrs. WIIHELM had attended several "publicity meetings" of the Massachusetts Progressive Citizens of America.

Reliable Boston Informants, who are familiar with some phases of Communist activity in the Greater Boston area, stated that they could

provide no information concerning the employee or her family.

Relatives

During the course of an applicant-type investigation concerning WARREN WIIHELM, husband of the employee, it was determined that no derogatory information was developed concerning WARREN WIIHELM in Boston, Massachusetts.

Investigation conducted at Boston, Massachusetts, reflected that WARREN WILHELM was born on September 19, 1917 at Staten Island, New York, the son of DONALL WILHELM (deceased) and NINA MAXWARREN.

Pursuant to provisions of Executive Order 9835, a Loyalty of Government Employees investigation was conducted during January, 1952, concerning DONALD WILHELM, Chief Materials Requisition and Control Branch, Federal Civil Defense Administration, Washington, D. C. Instant investigation reflected that DONALD WILHELM was born June 18, 1915 at Newark, New Jersey, the son of DONALD and NINA (WARREN) WILHELM. It is to be assumed that DONALD WILHELM is the brother of WARREN WILHELM, the husband of the employee.

Credit

Personnel of the Credit Bureau of Greater Boston, Incorporated, 11 Beacon Street, Boston, Massachusetts, advised they could locate no record for the employee.

The records of the Northampton Credit Bureau, Northampton, Massachusetts, were checked and no credit record was found concerning the employee.

Criminal

Personnel of the Massachusetts Board of Probation, Suffolk County Court House, Boston, Massachusetts, a central repository for all criminal conviction records in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, advised they could locate no record for the employee.

The records of the Northampton, Massachusetts Police Department were checked and no record was located concerning the employee.

Herewith are enclosed the original and seven copies of a report of SA ROBERT G. WELTON, Washington Field Office, dated August 6, 1953.

It is pointed out that this report does not praport to be a complete report and merely incorporates the results of the investigation to date.

It is also pointed out that for the information of the Bureau the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect that one WARREN WILHELM, formerly a Government economist, of the Harvard University Research Center was the writer of a report on Soviet Industrial Production as cited in the New York Times newspaper, their issue of February 23, 1950, on page 7.

These files further reflect that WARREN WILHELM, Foreign Policy Association, quoted with approval the "Daily Worker", issue of March 28, 1950, at page 4. This article cites the achievements of Soviet Socialism in industrializing four countries of Central Asia. These files also reflect that WARREN WILHELM quoted with approval the "Daily People's World" newspaper, Vissue of July 24, 1950, at page 6. The significance of this quote was not reflected in the files.

It is pointed out that this information was not included in referenced report inasmuch as the investigation was discontinued before sufficient investigation was conducted to identify WARREN WILHELM, mentioned above, as the husband of the employee.

It is also pointed out that original sources of the information above have not been checked. RUC


The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities contained no reference to the employee.

The files of Washington T-1, another Governmental agency which conducts personnel and security investigations, contains no pertinent identifiable security information pertaining to the employee.

Washington T-2, another Governmental agency which conducts personnel and security investigations, advised that their files contained no record of the employee.

The available files of the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary, the Sub-Committee to investigate the Administration of the Internal Security Act and other Internal Security Laws contained no reference to the employee.

The files of the Credit Bureau, Incorporated, Washington, D. C., which covers nearby surrounding counties of Montgomery County, Maryland, and Fairfax County, Virginia, reflect that the credit standing for the employee and her husband is satisfactory based on three accounts. These records reflect that the last credit check was made on June 5, 1951.

The files of the Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C., contained no record for the employee or her son. These files reflect, however, that one WARREN WILHELM, age 23, of 2456 20th Street, N.W., was arrested three times in 1941 and once in 1946 for minor traffic violations and forfeited the sums of \$5, \$10, and \$3, respectively.
